1 - Head Teacher's Message

Dear Parents/Carers,

Curriculum and Learning

It has been a very busy but exciting term, and I am very proud of the learning and resilience our pupils have shown to continue their progress. We want to ensure that we keep you well informed regarding the curriculum and children's achievement. This started in the first couple of weeks of term with our 'meet the teacher' meetings. We then had parent/teacher meetings in November when children's targets were shared with parents. We have another parent consultation day planned for Monday 24th February and further details will be sent nearer the time. Also on the 24th, Mishaal Kayani (our Educational Mental Health Practitioner) is visiting the school to offer support to parents on children anxiety and school avoidance. She will be available between 11:30am and 3:00pm.

In addition to this, Dacorum Family Services provide a similar service to Mishaal that parents can access for support with SEND, anxiety, school avoidance, self-esteem and emotional regulation. Some sessions are run as a surgery or a small group, other sessions work with

children on a 1:1 basis. Please speak to Ms Rumph or Mrs Fitzsimmons for further information.

As a way to keep you informed on the subjects and concepts your child will be learning, we created a curriculum overview per phase which highlights the topics and several objectives covered in each unit. We hope you find these useful in discussing learning with your child. The next overview will be emailed after the Christmas holidays.

Attendance

Our whole school attendance has dropped slightly over the last two weeks. We are at 93.9%. We were doing well in getting closer to 95% and I believe we still can. We have had a bout of chicken pox and sickness; hopefully with rest over the holiday period, pupils will be healthy and ready to be back in school every day.

Road Safety



We have an ongoing challenge of road safety during drop off and pick up.

We have an increasing amount of cars parking on the yellow zig-zag no stopping zones, which is causing potential danger for our children. We have received a number of concerns from parents and residents regarding this, and I urge that we all be more considerate when bringing children to and from school.

Suggestions to help the situation:

1. Do try to walk, scoot, cycle to limit the amount of traffic on the roads.

2. If driving, do try to park a little distance away (there is parking available on the main road and in the shopping area).

3. Use public transport or car share if possible.

I do accept that some parents are forced to drive to avoid being late for work but hopefully we can work together to alleviate the risk to our children. If parents have any suggestions to help with traffic please do notify our school office team. Also, if you witness any dangerous driving please ring 101.

Nursery

Nursery have had a very busy term! We been working on our positional language and mark making, and have enjoyed doing lots of Christmas crafting and cooking. Ash/Elm

We have had another busy few weeks in Reception, with our Nativity performances taking place in addition to our regular activities. I'm sure you'll agree that it was a great success! The children gained so much from taking part, it has been lovely to see their confidence and oracy developing through speech and song.

We have been reading the story, 'Can't You Sleep, Little Bear?' by Martin Waddell. The children practised joining in with the repetitive parts of the story and thought about what helped Little Bear get to sleep, as well as their own bedtime routines. We did role play around the story and made lanterns for the bear using our junk modelling resources.

In Maths we have been securing our knowledge around numbers to 5, including ways of making numbers up to 5, recognising that 2 and 2 makes 4, just as 1 and 3 does also. After the holidays we will be learning about common 2D shapes.

In Phonics, we have been focusing on blending the sounds we have introduced to read short words, known as consonant-vowel-consonant or CVC words. The children are also applying their phonic knowledge to write these words and practice the correct letter formation.

The children have been busy with a range of creative activities, ranging from junk modelling, collaging with natural materials, playdough, cutting and sticking as well as making a range of

Christmas decorations. The children are applying the skills and techniques we show them in adult-led sessions to make bring their imaginative creations to life. We always look forward to seeing what they will create next!

In PSHE, we have been talking about what it means to be a good friend and how we can help others.


Sycamore


Chestnut


In English we have been reading a book called 'Dragon Post' and learning how to write postcards.

Laurel

In Laurel we have been creating pneumatic toys as part of our Design and Technology unit. The children have designed their toys, picked out the materials and have been building their monsters to great effect. We've had monsters with wings, antennas and even bow ties! The children have really enjoyed putting these together and have shown their creativity and ingenuity.

Willow

Willow have been working hard experimenting designing and making pneumatic toys in DT. We had to plan the materials we would use, thinking about the weight of the material and ensuring it was not too heavy for the mechanism to make the toy move. We are extremely proud of the results.

Hawthorn

Over the past few weeks in Science, we have been exploring magnetism by sorting materials into those that are attracted to magnets and those that repel. Some of the results were quite surprising, sparking great discussions among the children.

In Design and Technology, we have been busy designing and creating pneumatic-powered toys. This project has allowed the children to apply their problem-solving skills and creativity to produce some fantastic working models.

Upper Key Stage 2

Maple

We have been creating our own stuffed toys in DT this half term. First, we designed our toy by considering the main component shapes required and created an appropriate template. Then ,we carefully measured and cut out the fabric. We have focused on running stitch and blanket stitch.

Oak

Science: This term, our Year 5 and 6 children explored the fascinating topic of Earth and Space. They have learned about the solar system, the movement of the Earth and moon, the importance of the sun and the order of the other planets. Through hands-on activities, research and interactive lessons, the children have developed a deeper understanding of how our planet fits into the vast universe. It has been exciting to see their curiosity grow as they uncover the wonders of space!

Gymnastics: Diving into the exciting world of gymnastics with a focus on "Flight." Children explored the concepts of balance, control, and movement as they performed various floor routines and used apparatus to simulate flight-like actions. It has been a great opportunity for them to build confidence and teamwork.

No Pens Day: Children actively enjoyed developing their oracy skills through engaging activities such as class debates, acting, and oral mathematics. These exercises continue to help children build confidence in speaking, use language precisely and be more expressive.
